Covid 19 Residents and staff contracting coronavirus from visitors Unexpected visitors. Contagious visitors spreading the virus.	Residents Employees Volunteers An infectious visitor could pass the virus to staff and/or residents.	A letter has been sent to all relatives outlining new measures for garden visits. These will be accompanied by visual aids such as posters and booklets. Visitors will complete a pre- screening form and will have their temperature checked with a non-invasive thermometer prior to each visit. The visit will not take place if the pre-screening questionnaire identifies any issues. All visits are pre-booked with a maximum of 40 minutes slots. PPE stocks more than sufficient and additional 3 months' worth of supplies held at Aylesford	3 - Unlikely	3 - Harmful	9 - Moderate Risk	An area has been identified outside away from the home that is used for visiting purposes only. Visiting is away from other residents with adequate space to allow for two metre social distancing. All visitors will wear a facemask, these will be provided by the home where visitors do not have them. Hand sanitiser will be provided for use. Residents will be asked to wash/disinfect their hands after the visit at the nearest hand washing facility preferably before entering the home and touching surfaces. All residents to briefed about the new measures. Residents not receiving a visit will asked not to approach the visiting area or any visitors who have arrived for other people. The toilet will be cleaned after each use to IPC standards. Visits will not be facilitated at mealtimes. In the event of inclement weather, and subject to availability and an additional risk assessment, the visit may take place in gazebo or covered sun deck. Alternatively, the visit will be cancelled.	3 - Unlikely	4 - Very Harmful	12 - Substantial Risk	In the event of any suspected or actual outbreak of COVID-19, or a suspected or known case of COVID-19 within a home, visitor restrictions will need to be implemented. In such circumstances the Operations Manager and Head of Care Services will be notified and communication sent out to visitors. Residents will be asked to wash/disinfect their hands after the visit at the nearest hand washing facility preferably before entering the home and touching surfaces. Only gifts that can be cleaned to IPC standards will be permitted and cleaned prior to passing to the resident. Where refreshments are provided washing and disposal will be undertaken to IPC standards.
