



Code Breakers - Worksheet

Use a 'pigpen' code, as described in these steps, to create your own code.

1. Draw two grids like these:




2. Write the letters of the alphabet inside the grids.



3. Each letter is represented by the part of the grid (the 'pigpen') which surrounds it. If it is the first letter of the two, just draw that part of the box or pen. If it is the second letter of the two, then also add a dot in the box/pen.

The letter 'A' would be:



The letter 'B' would be:



The word 'HELLO' would be:



4. Can you work out the rest of the alphabet? For example, what would the letter 'Y' be?

5. Use the pigpen code to write a coded note to Joyce Aylard to thank her and the other women who worked at Bletchley Park for the work they did in the Second World War.
