

VOLUNTEER ROLE DESCRIPTION:

Community Hub (Galanos House) Volunteer

Why get involved with the Royal British Legion (RBL)?

You don't need to be an RBL member or have links to the Armed Forces community to volunteer with us. You'll be joining the UK's leading Armed Forces charity, the heart of a national network that supports our Armed Forces community through thick and thin – ensuring their unique contribution is never forgotten.

RBL provides short or long-term care for members of the Armed Forces community in our Care Homes around the country.

How will I make a difference as a Community Hub Volunteer?

Galanos House is the first RBL care home to open a community Hub & Café located adjacent to the home.

In this role you will supporting RBL Care Services through contributing to the smooth operation of the Hub and Café; welcoming residents, relatives, and visitors from the local community plus undertaking a range of varied tasks to support its daily activities.

What will I be doing as an RBL Community Hub Volunteer?

- Assisting with the meeting and greeting of residents, relatives and visitors to the Hub and Cafe, providing a friendly, welcoming, and helpful service including:
 - Monitoring "chatty bench/table" and conversing with visitors
 - Assisting with the Hub and Café events and functions
 - Clearing cafe tables and wiping down tables
 - Helping maintain the Hub and Café information and notice display boards
 - Selling Poppy Shop merchandise, including the maintenance of displays, re-stocking items, showing items to customers and operating the till, card payment systems and cash handling.
- Responding to general queries about Galanos House/RBL Care Homes, and the Hub
- Referring specific enquiries about Galanos House to members of staff and/or signposting individuals and families to other suitable support provided by RBL

What skills and experience would I need, or could I develop?

- Enthusiastic, friendly with a willingness to get involved
- Interpersonal skills to communicate with others, engaging with residents, relatives, staff and other visitors to the Community Hub
- Retail experience and numeracy skills to supporting the sale of Poppy Shop items
- A broad understanding of the work of RBL and the different ways it supports the Armed Forces community.
- A commitment to acting in line with RBL policies and procedures, including those relating to data protection; confidentiality; safeguarding; health and safety and equality and diversity

This role is purely voluntary, and this arrangement is not meant to be a legally binding one or an employment contract.

What support will be available to me?

- An initial 2 day induction, followed by annual refresher training.
- A designated person to discuss your volunteering with
- Direct support from the staff team at the Community Hub and Café
- Training and opportunities for further development.
- Appropriate resources such as a volunteer agreement that outlines what you can expect from us plus the expectations we have of you

What else do I need to know?
